<u>Listservs®</u>

At the current time there are approximately 500,000+ mailing lists on the Internet with many powered by the original software call Listserv®. Over the years many folks have called these mailing lists Listservs® named for the software that powers the list. There are mailing lists that you can freely subscribe to covering almost any subject that you can think of. These lists are created around a single specific subject and everyone that belongs to the mailing list will receive emails from other subscribers either requesting information or disseminating new information about the single specific subject to all members of the list. I currently belong to over 150 lists and much of the current happenings information as well as current awareness information that I receive come from these lists! I call it my "real time" continuing and ongoing professional education directly from the Internet through eMails.
